


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Seating Plan for group activities (32 students in class, 4 pupils in a group, a total number of 8 groups)



Students will be allocated into groups of four by heterogeneous grouping method, so that students with different learning abilities are mixed. Students with higher ability can take up the lead role and offer help to other groupmates. Students with low ability can follow the instructions given by the leader and complete the task together. Learning in groups can resulted in better learning outcomes than independent learning, as high achievers can take up a more challenging role and students with lower ability can also learn under the assistance of peers.
