## Learning objectives:

## 1. Knowledge objective

• Students can listen, speak and read the words and phases: make a card; go to restaurant; give flowers; be happy, and can use them in real situations.

## 2. Ability objective

• Practice students' language expression ability: students can write an e-mail about "What did you do for your mother's birthday"

## 3. Emotional objective

• Sublimate the students' love for their mothers, encourage them to remember their mother's birthday and do something for their mother.

<ul> <li>✓ To activate the student's existing schema in order to lay a foundation relevant knowledge of the following text</li> <li>Time: 10 mins</li> <li>Pre-reading activity:</li> <li>✓ To enhance students' curiosity in order to naturally enter the reading activities</li> <li>Time: 15 mins</li> </ul>	<ol> <li>Teacher plays the "Peppa pig" cartoon excerpt "Mommy pig's birthday" (Refer to Appendix 1) so that students have an overall impression of the text before reading.</li> <li>Teacher asks students some questions like:         <ol> <li>Was Peppa pig happy or sad?</li> <li>Why was Peppa pig so happy?</li> </ol> </li> <li>If they cannot answer the questions, teacher gives them more simple questions like:         <ol> <li>Whose birthday? Peppa pig's birthday or mommy pig's birthday?</li> <li>What did they do for mommy pig?</li> </ol> </li> <li>Teacher creates a context for students to understand email.         <ol> <li>Created context: Miss. Ding receives an email from Ken (Refer to Appendix 2). Students observe the picture of the email and have a preliminary perception of the concept of email.</li> </ol></li></ol>	<ul> <li>Video of "Peppa pig" cartoon excerpt "Mummy pig's birthday" (Refer to Appendix 1)</li> <li>(Refer to Appendix 2)</li> <li>Reading concept E-mail from Ken (Refer to Appendix 2)</li> <li>Merere Dear Miss.Ding</li> <li>It was October 27th yesterday. It was my mother's birthday. Ann and I made a birthday cake for her. Dad and Kate cooked a big dinner. My mother forgot her birthday. <ul> <li>While-reading activity:</li> <li>✓ To help students clarify the reading text step by step</li> <li>Time: 15 mins</li> </ul>	<ol> <li>Students should skim the e-mail quickly and find the key points related to the questions. Around 3W1H "Who, When, What, How?" as the main line of the topic.</li> <li>Students share the points they circled with their desk mates. Each pair should work together to complete the following exercises. (Refer to Appendix3)</li> </ol>	<ul> <li>Reading exercises in textbook</li> <li>(Refer to Appendix 3)</li> </ul>

After discussing, teacher presents some pictures about what students do for their mothers (Refer to Appendix4), then invite students to share their ideas.</li> <li>Students should write down an e-mail to</li> </ol>	<ul> <li>Pictures of students' movements about "What did you do for your mother's birthday" (Refer to Appendix 4)</li> </ul>
